Please note we have been advised the following sentence is incorrect

MPI accepts that NZ is free from this fungi. Country freedom means that exporters do not have to treat their seed for *C higginsianum* before shipping to Australia.

CORRECTION -

NZGSTA advise a correction to the 'Brassica seed exports to Australia' article regarding treatment for *C higginsianum*. Treatments are still required for consignments of *Brassica rapa, Raphanus sativus and Eruca vesicaria*. MPI Plant Exports have updated the Country Freedom Status database declaring New Zealand free of Collectotrichum higginsianum and Fusarium oxysporum f. sp. Raphanin. However, as Australia has not specified in their new requirements in BICON, whether they will accept the country freedom of Colletotrichum higginsianum and Fusarium oxysporum f. sp. Raphanin, MPI's next step is to clarify this with Australia.
